## NE-1A SECTION CONCLAVE “MY LIFE, MY VISION” CAMP ROOSEVELT, EAST EDDINGTON, ME 11-13 JUNE 2010

What will you be doing on June 11-13, 2010? Members of the Section NE-1A Lodges will be traveling to Camp Roosevelt in East Eddington, ME for the Section NE-1A Conclave. The Section conclave is a gathering of the 6 OA lodges that cover the states of Maine, New Hampshire, and the Northeast Part of Massachusetts. The conclave has an attendance of about 300 people that come together each year at a summer camp in our section.

On Friday night, there are carnival activities, and on Saturday morning, you can attend training cells that include topics like Native American dancing, outdoor activities, and introduction to OA programs. In the afternoon, there are lodge competitions like volleyball, ultimate Frisbee, and OA Jeopardy. The most famous event at the conclave is the Healy Cup which first originated from Chippanyonk Lodge twelve years ago. The Healy Cup is an obstacle course that involves running, swimming, canoeing, and bike riding. After the evening dinner, there is a theme show that wraps up the conclave weekend. Conclaves are a great place to meet new people, and learn new things.

If you collect Scout patches, you will be able to trade with Brothers from the other lodges. Additionally there is a patch auction where you will be able to find some interesting additions for you collection.

This year, there are many great events being planned. If you want to have a great weekend, then come to Camp Roosevelt on June 11th. Fill out the enclosed registration forms and send them to the Lodge with your payment. Do it right away. Normally there is a discount for early registration but the Lodge has not been able to get the forms out since the training program has not yet been announced. It will be posted on our website as soon as it is made available.

Next year the conclave will be held in Daniel Webster Council and there will be a need for a lot of help to make it the best conclave since it was held at Hidden Valley in 2004. Participation at the 2010 Conclave will help give you a better idea where you can make a solid contribution.
